Amadeus return to Exeter by popular demand

The Amadeus Orchestra last visited Exeter three years ago when they played to a packed out Cathedral, performing Berlioz's *Sinfonie Fantastique*.

They return this year by popular demand under their principal conductor, Philip Mackenzie. Philip studied at Exeter University in the 1990s where he established the Amadeus Orchestra. They are both now internationally recognised.

People with a long memory may remember the Amadeus' first concert in St Sidwell's Church in March 1990 when they performed Mozart's *Requiem*, or their second at the Plaza with Griff Rhys Jones narrating *Peter and the Wolf*.

They have come a long way since then, having broadcast on Radio 3, Radio 4 and Classic FM, toured China twice and India once and given televised concerts to millions of people.
